2. Is this an urban or rural area and how many people live in this specific area?

Fatick Region Dioffior: peri-urban: total pop: 59,799 Foundiougne: rural: total pop: 41,121 Guinguineo: peri-urban: total pop: 61,065

Thies Region Popenguine: rural total pop: 33,944 Joal Fadiouth: urban: 76,641

3. Is this a high risk malaria area? If yes, why do you designate it as high?

The locations are in areas where malaria is endemic and seasonal and are therefore considered high risk in Senegal. This national distribution is to go ahead just before a rainy season and therefore an annual peak in malaria cases.

4. How many *reported* cases of malaria and malaria deaths were there in this area in 2005? If you do not have statistics please make a qualitative comment.

In the 2006 Malaria Indicator Survey estimated that 37% of children under 5 had had an episode of fever or convulsions,

(clinical indicators for a case of malaria). In 2006 there were 1,456,000 malaria cases causing 9600 deaths in total in Senegal (WHO World Malaria Report 2008)

5. Is this distribution of nets 'blanket coverage' of an area/village or to a select/vulnerable group? If the latter, please describe this group.

The target group is children between 6 and 59 months and pregnant women.

6. What is the existing level of ITN use in this area? Are there existing bednet distribution programmes in this area?

In 2008 there was an LLIN distribution in the area, this subsequent distribution aims to fill the gaps still outstanding in LLIN ownership in the target groups.

7. Why was the area/villages chosen for bednet distribution and who made this decision? Please provide the name, position and organisation of the person/s making the decision.

The locations are in areas where Red Cross teams will be carrying out the distribution following discussions with other distribution partners such as PMI and PNLP (National Malaria Control Programme) and where it is felt the donor requirements can be efficiently and economically met.

8. Have you consulted with the National Malaria Programme in your country about this distribution and what was their response? Please provide the name, position and contact details of the person/s with whom you have liaised.

There is a national IEC campaign planned including television and radio spots in two languages. The Red Cross plan to carry out pre distribution community sensitisation.

10. Please describe how the bednets will be distributed, by whom, whether distribution will be a focussed effort or part of a combined programme and if there will be an information/education component to the distribution? Please indicate over what time period (typically, the number of days or weeks) the distribution will occur.

Vouchers will be distributed to the target group during doorto-door distribution of vitamin A and mebendazole. The vouchers are then redeemable at local fixed LLIN distribution points.

11. What **post-distribution follow-up** is planned to assess the level of usage (hang-up percentage) of the nets? How long after the distribution will this assessment take place? Will you provide us with the findings? What will you be able to do subsequently to increase net hang-up if relevant?

There are due to be follow-up surveys one month and four months after distribution. In May 2010 a national DHS survey

with additional questions regarding LLIN use will take place. Subject to funding availability the Red Cross plan to carry out door to door Hang Up activities directly after the campaign to ensure nets are hanging and then Keep Up activities which form part of community health activities to maintain awareness of key health messages regarding malaria and the significance of net use.
