## Location: Fairway Childrens Centre, Lutengo, Mukono, Uganda

#### **Allocation**

The distribution area was allocated as part of the mission statement of the Africa Childrens Development Trust (ACDT) to provide each child that passes through the charity with a life-saving mosquito net. The distribution allocation was given to the ACDT following a request from MYDEL for assistance with mosquito nets.

The Fairway Childrens Centre is a school/orphanage set up by the Reverend Solomon to help the community of Lutengo & the surrounding villages. Within this centre is a nursery school, primary school, secondary school & orphanage. There are many children who stay at the centre permanently as well as many children in the community. This distribution was to provide nets for all the children staying at the school & also to the children who live in the local community.

This area was identified as an area of need not currently or in the future planned to be receive support from the Uganda Malaria Control Programme.

#### Net Day!

This was our 2<sup>nd</sup> visit to Fairway having visited last year to see the Centre. It is amazing work that Reverend Solomon has achieved through dedication & love for children & seeing them lead fulfilling lives. It is an enviable 7 acres that they have which is a dramatic different to the .3 of an acre we have Ndeeba Primary School on, one of the ACDT's other projects. When we arrived we were welcomed warmly with cheers & excitement. Usually with so many children it is often chaotic as the children are so excited, but these children were so well behaved that the distribution went so smoothly & they are all a credit to Reverend Solomom & to the other teachers & carers at Fairway.

### Location: Cherish Uganda, Entebbe, Uganda

#### **Allocation**

The distribution area was allocated as part of the mission statement of the Africa Childrens Development Trust (ACDT) to provide each child that passes through the charity with a life-saving mosquito net. The distribution allocation was given to the ACDT following a request from Cherish Uganda for assistance with mosquito nets.

Cherish Uganda is an organization dedicated to caring for children with HIV/AIDS by providing family units for children at this site in Entebbe Uganda. Each unit house a group of orphaned children with a 'mother' & each unit functions like a proper home. This gives the children a chance to lead as normal a life as possible, with onsite care for their medical needs & a chance to be educated. The organization strives to give children hope that HIV/AIDS is not a death sentence, but something that can be managed so that each child can lead a fulfilling life.

This area was identified as an area of need not currently or in the future planned to be receive support from the Uganda Malaria Control Programme.

The fundraising for these nets came from a number of different sources, from individual donators to groups of people & schools all located in the UK, which was fantastic!

#### Net Day!

On arriving at Cherish Uganda, we were greeted with open arms by all the children. There is a school next door which delivers education to children not only in the units but children in the community too. We were shown around & introduced to Gloria, one of the 'mums'. We were invited to see one of the family units which really is like a proper home & were told of the other plans that Cherish Uganda have for example more homes & supporting their work through their own agricultural projects.

When we distributed the nets, the children were so excited! It means so much to know that these children who are already facing the challenges of HIV/AIDS now do not also have to deal with the potential devastating

effects of malaria. We hope that through the work Cherish, ACDT & The Against Malaria Foundation that these children can grow & prosper without the risk of malaria.



#### Follow up

We advised everyone at Cherish Uganda of the follow up program that follows this distribution & so we believe that this will be the start of a long friendship between Cherish Uganda & the ACDT.

#### <u>Summary</u>

When children are already struggling with the effects of HIV/AID's the last thing they need is to be exposed to malaria as well. # Location: Mengo Youth Development Link (MYDEL), Kampala, Uganda

#### **Allocation**

Mengo Youth Development Link (MYDEL) is a local Non-government organization which was conceived by Ugandans to contribute towards poverty reduction efforts in Uganda. MYDEL contributes towards poverty alleviation through enhancing the functioning and capabilities of the poor communities. MYDEL has contributed most of its efforts to the slums of Kampala district where the community is much affected with poverty brought by HIV/AIDS, non-parenting children, less education among the youth, women, and many more.

Unless you have ever slept without a net, you have no idea how awful it can be & so to receive a net was the most amazing gift that they would never be able to afford themselves. We were alos greeted by the community chairperson & the one of the candidates for the forthcoming elections both very grateful to the ACDT for choosing to support their community in this way.
