Lowero Diocese (1,220 nets) - The rural diocese covers a huge area of sub-counties identified as in need of mosquito nets. There are a number of vulnerable children's groups within the Lowero District encompassing HIV, schools & local village communities. (Lat 1.349019400/Long 32.38544470)

Palissa District (1,150 nets) - 3 rural schools identified as areas of need. Children at the schools & their siblings are part of this distribution. (Lat 1.16667940/33.70985690)

COMDEV Bweogere Town (210 nets) - COMDEV are a local organisation set up to assist the community through education & health. An urban slum area that currently has a great need for mosquito nets for the children under the various projects. (Lat 0.36465310/Long 32.64801220)

Mercy Childrens Home (80 nets) and Bweya Childrens Home (80 nets) Kajansi - 2 childrens home struggling under extreme challenges identified as in desperate need of support to help their problems with malaria.(Lat 0.2020344o/Long 32.54018940)

90 nets - being allocated. Will advise.

2. Is this an urban or rural area and how many people live in this specific area?

Rural and urban areas. Exact populations not known.

3. Is this a high risk malaria area? If yes, why do you designate it as high?

This is a high risk area not just because of Uganda being a high risk country but because of the location and the conditions these children live in. Some areas have slum conditions; others are rural and exposed. Many live very far from any medical facilities, some are near wetlands.

4. Baseline malaria case information. How many <u>reported</u> cases of malaria and malaria deaths were there in this <u>specific</u> area in the most recent period available? We are looking for data from health clinics in the area. Month by month information is strongly preferred. We are NOT looking for regional level/national level information. Please cite your source. Baseline malaria case information forms the basis of comparison post-distribution.

No bednet distributions to this area known. The vulnerable groups were identified by the National Malaria Control Programme & the Uganda Ministry of Health.

The groups targeted were referred to ACDT by Connie Balayo from the Ministry of Health's National Malaria Control Programme. They are all vulnerable children's groupa. This supports the work of the ACDT in supporting vulnerable children through mosquito net distributions.
