
Q1. How many nets were in the surveyed households?


Q2. Are they being used at night?


Q3. Are they being used correctly?


Q4. What is the condition of the nets?

Q5. Who is sleeping under the nets?

The following question relates to the coverage of sleeping spaces by any nets, regardless of origin.

This provides an indication of how many nets are still needed to achieve universal coverage.

Q5. What is the overall net coverage of sleeping spaces?

Action recommendations:

1. Additional malaria education

- encourage all nets to be hung. Target: 95%+
- emphasise net care
- demonstrate and remind of correct net usage
- message: all sleeping spaces covered helps them all
- involve community leaders and all community
- whole community address

2. Revisit houses with 'net, but not hung' one month later

3. Further nets required

- to achieve universal coverage/replace unusable nets
- to all sleeping spaces in community as majority of existing nets now at end of useful life
