150LLINs were delivered between Sept and Oct 2007 to Jabulani Village, Zimbabwe by Ndebele Arts Project

The ravages of AIDS, malaria, political instability and economic hardship have taken their toll on these artists and their families. Life expectancy is now just 37 years. The death rate has grown over 200% since 1990. Without our intervention and aid the entire village and its artists are in danger of disappearing.

NAP purchased 150 treated bed nets for village families. This aid is an important step in the prevention of malaria, one of the biggest disease killers in the world. Because these villagers live near the mighty Zambezi River, they are especially susceptible to the spread of mosquito carrying malaria
