100 nets will be distributed to three specific locations where there is desperate need:

- Kiro Kabowa Childrens Centre, Sembule, Kampala: 60 nets
- Kikusa Orphanage, Mwela, Wakiso: 19 nets
- Nagalama Hospital, Luwero District: 21 nets

### 2. Is this an urban or rural area and how many people live in this specific area?

- 1. Urban Area Slum area on the outskirts of Kampala. Population of whole slum unknown. Net distribution to the school/orphanage only.
- 2. Rural area, small children's home 28 children in residence
- 3. Rural hospital serving the area of Luwero. 100 bed hospital with existing 80% net coverage. Population of the area unknown.

#### 3. Is this a high risk malaria area? If yes, why do you designate it as high?

The school area in the slum has a high risk of malaria due to the environment in a swampy, marsh area with threats from a continual flooding river & no drainage. The school reports average 4-5 cases of malaria per week from the 132 children who attend.

The home in Kikusa has better drainage facilities but is however plagued by mosquitoes with many of the children having had malaria 3 times already in 2008

The hospital is a general hospital treating all ages for a range of conditions & operations & all the cases of malaria in that area.

4. How many *reported* cases of malaria and malaria deaths were there in this area in 2005? If you do not have statistics please make a qualitative comment.

There are no existing bed net distributions that I have been able to locate. From basic questioning I believe the net usage in these areas is low, due to cost of purchasing the nets.

The locations for the distribution was decided by Nikki Collinson the founder of the Africa Childrens Development Trust based on the work being completed by the organisation.

Not contacted given this is a very small distribution.

We have established the number of nets needed in each of the locations.

The nets will be distributed by Nikki Collinson & put up over the course of one week in April by Nikki & 2 colleagues. We will physically put up each & every net! There will be basic malaria education and instruction as to proper use of the nets.

11. What post-distribution follow-up is planned to assess the level of usage (hang-up percentage) of the nets? How long after the distribution will this assessment take place? Will you provide us with the findings? What will you be able to do subsequently to increase net hang-up if relevant?

ACDT return visits will be planned for Sept 2008 to confirm continual usage.
